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Admission Arrangement and Over-subscription Criteria Arrangements as Determined:- ADMISSIONS POLICY FOR: Barnsole Primary School September 2024

Barnsole Primary School takes in children from 3-11yrs (including Nursery) with inclusive provision.

The main principle of admission to Barnsole Primary School is to maintain the character of the school serving its community. Barnsole Primary School is an inclusive school that welcomes children from all backgrounds and abilities.

There is no guarantee of a place for any child meeting our over-subscription criteria. Admission to our school is not dependent upon any 'voluntary' contribution. The school participates in the Local Authority co-ordinated scheme and all deadlines within that should be adhered to by applicants.

As required in The School Admissions Code 2021, all schools must have oversubscription criteria for each 'relevant age group' and the highest priority must be given, unless otherwise provided in the code, to looked after children and all previously looked after children, including those children who appear (to the admission authority) to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted. Previously looked after children are children who were looked after but ceased to be so because they were adopted (or became subject to a child arrangements order or special guardianship order). All references to previously looked after children in the code mean such children who were adopted (or subject to child arrangements orders or special guardianship orders) immediately following having been looked after and those children who appear (to the admission authority) to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted.

Home address: Proof of residence will be required by the co-ordinated scheme. The offer of a place may be withdrawn if proof of residency is not met. Where a child lives part of the week with one parent and part with another member of the family, the 'home address' will be considered to be the residence where the child spends at least three nights of the school week each week.

Parents are encouraged to register their interest in a place for their nursery child and places will be allocated to start in the term (Autumn, Spring and Summer terms) following the child's third birthday. The school will allocate all places available at time of application and if therefore places in the nursery are oversubscribed then these will be allocated using the same oversubscription criteria as the Reception admissions over-subscription criteria below..

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

The level of ability of a child or any special needs that s/he may have plays no part in the admissions policy of this school where we are properly equipped to deal with the needs of the child.

Barnsole Primary School meets the agreed criteria concerning the delivery of the Foundation Stage of Learning in accordance with the Local Authority's policy and will admit four year olds to the Foundation Stage Classes in one intake in September. The children due to be admitted during the academic year 2025/2026 are those born between September 2020 and 31 August 2021. However, children reach compulsory school age at the start of the term following their fifth birthday. Parents are not obliged to start their child at Barnsole Primary School until the beginning of the term after the child is five. Therefore, parents who have been offered a September place may ask to defer their child's admission until the beginning of the spring term without losing the offer of a place.

Parents of children with summer term birthdays (1 April to 31 August 2021) may ask to start their child in Year 1 in September 2026 but the reception place will not be saved. Parents will have to re-apply for a

Year 1 place.

The Planned Admission Number (PAN) for the year commencing September 2024 will be 90.

It should be noted that admission to Barnsole School Nursery does not constitute admission to Barnsole Primary School; nor does attendance at the nursery class give priority to admission to Barnsole Primary School.

CASUAL/IN-YEAR ADMISSIONS

Any family wishing to apply for a place at Barnsole Primary School will need to complete a casual admission application form available from the school, or by completing the Medway Council application form (IYCAF).

OVERSUBSCRIPTION CRITERIA

Where the number of applications received via the Medway co-ordinated scheme exceeds 90, the PAN, places will be allocated in the following priority order:

- ❖ Children in public care/looked after children and previously looked after children - as defined in the Medway Council Co-ordinated admissions scheme;
(A “looked after child” or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangements, or special guardianship order* including those who appear to the school to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted. A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (see the definition in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989).
*An adoption order is an order under the Adoption Act 1976 (see section 12 adoption orders) and children who were adopted under the Adoption and Children Act 2002 (see section 12 adoption orders). A “child arrangements order” is an order settling the arrangements to be made as to the Children and Families Act 2014. Section 14A of the Children Act 1989 defines a “special guardianship order” as an order appointing one or more individuals to be a child’s special guardian (or special guardians)).
- ❖ Current family association - (a brother or sister in Barnsole Primary School at the time of application and still attending in September 2024),
- ❖ Child’s health reasons - medical evidence must be provided which demonstrates a specific health reason which requires a child to attend Barnsole Primary School as the preferred school,
- ❖ A child can be considered under this criterion where a member of Teaching Staff has been employed at the school for 2 or more years at the time the application is made. Teaching staff means staff employed and salaried as Teachers and Teaching Assistants but does not include voluntary staff,
- ❖ Nearness of children’s homes and ease of access to Barnsole Primary School (In the event of a tie within any criterion, before the last criterion, places will be allocated to those living closest to the school measured by the shortest available walking route.)

Evidence of residence may be required.

In cases of over subscription, parents can ask for the children’s names to be placed on a waiting list held by Barnsole Primary School.

The children will be ranked according to school’s over subscription criteria and the Local Authority co-ordinated scheme and not according to the date when the child’s name was added to the list.

Should there be an oversubscription an Admissions Committee comprising of the Local Academy Council, with the Head of School in attendance, will meet to review each case independently.

RIGHT OF APPEAL

If having applied the oversubscription criteria, the school is unable to offer a place; parents will be contacted in writing and advised of the reason why a place could not be offered. Parents wishing to appeal should write to the Clerk to the Appeal Panel at the school and appeal papers will be forwarded on request. These should again be returned to the Clerk to the Appeal Panel at Barnsole Primary School and the closing date on the forms must be adhered to.

REVIEW

The Admissions Policy will be reviewed annually by the Full Trust Board.

LEGISLATION

Academies are required by their funding agreements to comply with the Code and the law relating to admissions, though the Secretary of State has the power to vary this requirement where there is demonstrable need.
